	Activity #1  - Using neutral syllable "bum," audiate the resting tone for "Hello Welcome."  - Sing the song and have the students audiate (plant a musical seed) the resting tone after each phrase on direction (bounce & flick)  - Teach and evaluate resting tone  Activity #2  - Using neutral syllable "bum," audiate different tones /sounds and ask students to identify if that "seed" belongs in our musical garden  Prepare for next time: "Our garden can have more than one kind of seed"

John the Rabbit (Minor Tonality)(10 Minutes)	Focus on tonal function of tonic
	This is a call and response song that focuses student efforts on singing the resting tone of E.  - Prepare student by playing the characteristic functions of e minor on the keyboard Practice the "Oh Yes!" response with the students to orient to the resting tone Variations Have students lead - Have students audiate "Oh Yes" silently - Have students audiate "Oh yes" individually - Act out the actions
Fast & Slow - (Triple Meter) - Beat Buddies (10 minutes)	Audiate common rhythms from the piece:
	- Du Da Di - Du Da Di - Du - Du Di, Du Di - Du Du Du
	Note: This piece relies on switching emphasis from the Macro beat to the micro beat to change the feel of the music between fast and slow.
	Review Procedures for Beat Buddies:
	<ul><li>You get what you get</li><li>Be kind to your buddy</li><li>Hold onto them, do not throw them</li></ul>
	Play the song and have the students use the buddies to move to the fast and slow beats.
